


Figure 1. Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature for InGaN




Figure 2. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage




Figure 3. Specific Luminous Flux vs. Forward Current






Figure 4. Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength




Figure 5. Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength




Figure 6. Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength






Figure 7. Dominant Wavelength vs. Forward Current




Figure 9. Dominant Wavelength vs. Forward Current




Figure 8. Dominant Wavelength vs. Forward Current






Figure 10. Relative Luminous Intensity



Mounting Pad Layout



METHOD OF TAPING/POLARITY AND TAPE AND REEL

SMD LED (VLM3 - SERIES)

Vishay's LEDs in SMD packages are available in an antistatic 8 mm blister tape (in accordance with DIN IEC 40 (CO) 564) for automatic component insertion. The blister tape is a plastic strip with impressed component cavities, covered by a top tape.




Figure 11. Tape Dimensions in mm for PLCC-2

REEL PACKAGE DIMENSION IN MM FOR SMD LEDS, TAPE OPTION GS08 (= 1500 PCS.)




Figure 12. Reel Dimensions - GS08

REEL PACKAGE DIMENSION IN MM FOR SMD LEDS, TAPE OPTION GS18 (= 8000 PCS.) PREFERRED




Figure 13. Reel Dimensions - GS18

SOLDERING PROFILE




Figure 14. Vishay Lead (Pb)-free Reflow Soldering Profile (acc. to J-STD-020B)





Figure 15. Double Wave Soldering of Opto Devices (all Packages)



DRY PACKING

The reel is packed in an anti-humidity bag to protect the devices from absorbing moisture during transportation and storage.



FINAL PACKING

The sealed reel is packed into a cardboard box. A secondary cardboard box is used for shipping purposes.

RECOMMENDED METHOD OF STORAGE

Dry box storage is recommended as soon as the aluminum bag has been opened to prevent moisture absorption. The following conditions should be observed, if dry boxes are not available:

- Storage temperature 10 °C to 30 °C
- Storage humidity ≤ 60 % RH max.

After more than 672 h under these conditions moisture content will be too high for reflow soldering.


In case of moisture absorption, the devices will recover to the former condition by drying under the following condition:

192 h at 40 °C + 5 °C/- 0 °C and < 5 % RH (dry air/nitrogen) or

96 h at 60 °C + 5 °C and < 5 % RH for all device containers or

24 h at 100 °C + 5 °C not suitable for reel or tubes.

An EIA JEDEC Standard JESD22-A112 level 2a label is included on all dry bags.

ESD PRECAUTION

Proper storage and handling procedures should be followed to prevent ESD damage to the devices especially when they are removed from the antistatic shielding bag. Electro-static sensitive devices warning labels are on the packaging.
